Deaf and Hard of Hearing
Be counted in 2010!

- What is the census? The census is a count of everyone who lives in the United States.
- Who is counted? Every United States citizen must be counted.
- When will we be counted? Census Day is April 1, 2010.
- How are we counted? A census form will be mailed to your home in March 2010. If you do not fill out and return your form, a census worker will visit your home to fill one out.
- Why do we need to be counted? A census is required by the US Constitution every 10 years. The census shows the number of people in different areas and helps the government to decide how to spend funding for community services.
- The 2010 Census is short with only 10 questions. Deaf Community Resource Center will have people who will be able to answer your questions and help you fill out your questionnaire if you need help.
